HTM WORK AND INTERNSHIP REQUIREMENTS

- 400 hours of work experience
 - Complete as a Freshman or Sophomore before entering Upper Division
- TWO Paid internships
 - 300 hours
 - Paid
 - One Junior and one Senior year
 - Ms. Jeffries helps you find a job
 - Must attend “Pre-Internship Meeting” Sophomore year to learn more



99% Placement Rate upon graduation!

RTM WORK AND INTERNSHIP REQUIREMENTS

- RTM 284 – 125 hours of experience in recreation leadership
 - Completed Freshman or Sophomore year
- RTM 498 – 40 off-campus hours required per week while in the 12 units course
 - Completed Junior or Senior year
